**The 23<sup>rd</sup> Annual Preventive Medicine Board Review Course** will be held at the Hyatt Crystal City (VA) August 14-18, 2010.

The five-day, 40-hour Review Course, which offers a source of lifelong learning credits toward American Board of Preventive Medicine (ABPM) recertification, covers all areas of the ABPM certification examination. Sessions on Biostatistics, Epidemiology, Health Services Administration, Occupational Medicine fundamentals, Environmental Health, Injury Epidemiology and Prevention, Clinical Preventive Services, Chronic Disease and Infectious Disease, and Behavioral Medicine form the core portion of the course. The specialty portion of the course is spent in breakout groups for Public Health/General Preventive Medicine, Aerospace Medicine, and Occupational Medicine.

**Just Need a Refresher?** The first two days of the Preventive Medicine Review Course will be offered as a "Weekend Refresher" course. Sessions include a five-hour Biostatistics review and a three-hour Epidemiology review. Other one-and-a-half to two-hour core classes are also included.

**WEBINAR: Preventing Prematurity: Opportunities for Health Plans**

Over the past two decades, the rate of preterm births has increased by 36 percent with preterm births now accounting for 12.5 percent of all live births. Contributing to this increase is a rise in elective inductions and cesarean deliveries prior to 37 weeks gestation, despite evidence and guidelines recommending against elective deliveries before 39 weeks without clinical indication. Preterm births are both emotionally and financially costly, taking a toll on the family and resulting in high direct health care costs due to longer hospital stays and hospital readmissions. This webinar will bring together health plans and leaders in the maternal and child health community to share innovative programs and explore strategies to reduce preterm birth and the associated costs.
